

# People Moves | Investment Management EMEA

- abrdn's chief executive for discretionary management, Richard Charnock, is to retire following 15 years in the company. Discretionary business director David Driver will succeed him, having joined Abrdn in 2010 and has held discretionary director roles for more than 20 years. Additionally, abrdn has announced the birth of a 'Sustainability Group', which will lead the green strategy of the company. It will be led by the group's former global head of responsible investment, Amanda Young, who has been named chief sustainability officer.
- AJ Bell has hired the manager of the CRUX UK Core fund Jamie Ward as its head of investment solutions.
- AllianzGI has hired ex Newton duo Erik Swords and Justin Sumner as portfolio managers as tech veterans Walter Price and Huachen Chen announce their retirement.
- Axa Investment Management has appointed Amit Singh as its new head of inclusion, diversity and engagement. Most recently Amit was Axa's head of human resources for Asia and Japan and joined the firm in 2015.
- BNP Paribas Asset Management's Isabelle Bourcier has resigned from her role as head of quantitative and index management within BNP Paribas Asset Management's multi-asset quantitative and solutions arm. The asset manager has also named Nadia Grant as its new head of global equities. Grant joins from Capital Group, where she moved to in October 2020 as a portfolio manager. Additionally, BNP Paribas Real Estate UK has hired Donna Rourke as director of environmental, social and governance. Rourke joins BNPPRE from the University College of Estate Management, where she led the marketing communications and brand team.
- Capital Group has hired Kat Ferris from Morgan Stanley Investment Management for the newly-created role of head of product development for Europe and Asia.

- Close Brothers Asset Management has appointed a former head of Standard Life Aberdeen's platforms business as its new chief executive. Eddy Reynolds will take up the position at Close Brothers' from 7 March, succeeding Martin Andrew.
- Credit Suisse Asset Management has named Filippo Rima as global head of investment. Rima was most recently head of equities at the firm, having first joined the asset manager from Winterthur Asset Management in 2005. Meanwhile, the asset manager has also hired Anthony Philips as a senior fixed income fund manager.
- Crestbridge has hired former BlackRock and Axa Real Estate finance expert Barry Hindmarch to head up its UK real estate business to replace the outgoing Paul Windsor.
- EQ Investors' joint CEO. Mark Howlett. has left his role at the financial planning and sustainable discretionary fund management firm.
- Fidelity International's Jun Tano is retiring from the industry after 20 years with the firm. The strategy will now be overseen by Hokeun Chung, a portfolio manager and equities director who has been working at the company for 16 years. Cenk Simsek and Eddie Tajima will join him as co-managers on the fund on 1 April 2022.
- First Sentier Investors has made a triple appointment to its responsible investment (RI) and corporate sustainability capabilities. Joanne Lee has been given the role of RI specialist. Another new hire is Cressida Grant, who joins as head of corporate philanthropy. She will report to Rebecca Antonini who has been appointed to the newly-created role of head of corporate sustainability.

As a result, Isaac Thong is to assume Titherington's role on the \$368m JPM Total Emerging Markets Income fund. Additionally, the asset manager has created two new roles within its sustainable investing team. Roland Rott will be the **head of sustainable investing research,** while Soňa Stadtelmeyer-Petru has been hired as lead for sustainable investing strategy in Europe, The Middle East and Africa (EMEA). Roland was most recently head of ESG and sustainable investment research at La Française. Soňa joins from Allianz Investment Management, where she covered a range of ESG, responsible and impact investing related roles, Finally, JPMorgan Chase has promoted Europe managing director Matthew Melling as chief financial officer of its international consumer business, which includes recently-acquired robo adviser Nutmeg.
- Jupiter Asset Management's global emerging markets head of strategy Ross Teverson has left the business. Following his departure, Nick Payne has been appointed lead manager on the global emerging markets equities team.
